



Dr. Amy Proulx is Professor and Academic Program Coordinator of Food Innovation Programs at Niagara College. She created the Food and Beverage Innovation Centre at Niagara College in 2012, a federally funded research group which supports industry with innovation and continuous improvement. Her current research focuses on capacity building both nationally and internationally for TVET sector leadership in applied research and education systems for agriculture and food systems sustainability.

She is a co-leader in the Sustainable Food Systems for Canada national network, focusing on education for sustainable agrifood sector innovation.
